Frequently Asked Questions about the CACG “Go To College”

What is the CACG “Go To College” program?

The CACG “Go To College” program is an informational campaign developed by the Nevada P-16 Advisory Council and its partners that will foster a college-going culture, while communicating both college and workforce-readiness expectations to low-income students and their parents.

What is the goal of the CACG “Go To College” program?

The “Go To College” program aims to increase the number of Nevada students who pursue educational goals beyond high school. Activities to achieve this goal include:

- Implementation of classroom visits in grades 3, 6, and 8 by K-12 representatives, local celebrities, postsecondary professionals, business professionals and peer mentors.
- Hosting meetings and workshops for counselors, teachers, administrators and parents in order to train and educate in outreach and college application assistance.
- Develop and run television, print, and radio ads showcasing high-need industries in Nevada.

What is the benefit to partnering with the CACG “Go To College” program?

CACG “Go To College” offers additional outreach to low-income, first-time college going students and their families, providing guidance and resources necessary for college and workforce preparation. In a state that is experiencing rapid population growth, the CACG “Go To College” program will:

- Schedule interactive classroom visits to engage and excite students about going to college;
- Further stress the importance of continuing education beyond high school through information sharing; and
- Provide additional training and support to parents, school teachers and counselors in order to recruit and retain students in college and workforce preparatory programs.
